<b>Eligibility of participant:</b>	Participants from NSOs must be endorsed by the National Scout Organization and must be between 18 to 26 years old on the date of the Moot. Leaders who are interested in this National Rover Moot are also welcome to apply for participation as MPT (Moot Planning Team).
<b>Language</b>	<b>Chinese</b> Most of the activities of 14 <sup>th</sup> National Rover Moot will be conducted in Chinese; although we will have interpreters we still believe that participants who know Chinese/ Mandarin are more preferable.
<b>Moot Registration Fee</b>	<b><u>USD250 Dollars per participant(pay at the counter)</u></b>  The moot fee for international participants is 250 USD. Included in the fee is the moot program, meals from dinner of August 17 to the lunch of August 23, medical care in the case of illness. The 14 <sup>th</sup> National Rover Moot participation pack, including a neckerchief, badge and a handbook.  Participants will have the option of bringing their own private camping equipment or renting it from the Moot office.



After your NSO approve rover registration. Participants are required to fill out the online "14<sup>th</sup> National Rover Moot Registration Form" individually.



➤ **Further information for visiting Taiwan:**

<p><b>Arrive by Airplane</b></p>	<p>The international airport that is closest to the campsite is Taiwan Kaohsiung international airport (KHH).</p>
<p><b>VISA</b></p>	<p>Citizens of some countries will require valid visa to enter Taiwan (R.O.C). Thus, all participants should obtain an entry visa before traveling to Taiwan (R.O.C.) and can consult their local travel advice service or the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in most capital cities. <p><b>Venue Location</b></p>	<p>14<sup>th</sup> National Rover Moot will be held in Wushantou reservoir, Tainan City, located in the southern part of Taiwan.</p> 
<p><b>Weather in Tainan</b></p>	<p>In Taiwan, summer is from June to August. Temperatures hit 34/35°C (93/95°F), and the weather is really humid and a little chance of rain during the period of time, so an umbrella may be necessary</p>
<p><b>Voltage</b></p>	<p>Electric current of 110 volts at 60 cycles is used in Taiwan, participants from Europe, Australia or South-East Asia will need an adaptor or transformer. Many buildings have sockets with 220 volts especially for the use of air conditioners.</p>

<p><b>Currency</b></p>	<p>The Republic of China's (Taiwanese) unit of currency is the New Taiwan Dollar (NT\$), which has five denominations in paper money and five in coins. Paper money comes in NT\$2000, NT\$1000, NT\$500, NT\$200, and NT\$100 denominations. Coins come in NT\$50, NT\$20, NT\$10, NT\$5 and NT\$1 denominations.</p> <p>Our currency rankings show that the most popular Taiwan New Dollar exchange rate is the USD to TWD rate, and the rate is around \$1US dollar to NT\$32 dollars.</p> <p>Major credit cards such as American Express, Master Card, Visa, and Diners Club are accepted and traveler's checks may be cashed at foreign-exchange banks, some tourist-oriented businesses, and most international tourist hotels.</p>
<p><b>Time</b></p>	<p>Taiwan Standard Time, UTC +8 hours.</p>
<p><b>Mobile Phones</b></p>	<p>GSM mobile phones operate in the 900 MHz or 1800 MHz frequency bands.</p>
<p><b>Anti-smoking Law</b></p>	<p>Smoking is banned in all closed public and work premises, including catering and accommodation establishments.</p>
